4. Board of Directors Co-Chairs & Executive Directors' Reports

- Paula Rideout thanked Nancy Thurston on behalf of the Board for stepping into Linda's role in Colchester.
- Sarah MacMaster and Nancy Thurston presented the Executive Director reports. They highlighted several
 key developments over the past year, including activities at the new sites in Wentworth and Portapique,
 ongoing work through the Community Collaborative Food Network, the continued roles of the Cultural
 Connector and Family Navigator positions, improvements to the pension plan, and upcoming plans to
 repair the roof at the Truro Centre.
- · 2023-2024 statistics for the centres were shared.

5. Financial Report

Ryan Beazley presented the Auditor's Report for 2023-2024.

- The increase in amortization of capital assets in the Colchester statement of cash flows was because this was the first full year of owning the building.
- Professional fees increased due to new funding streams and deferred funds, which supported a much-needed policy overhaul at both centres.
- Furniture and equipment funds (laptops and shed purchases for the Mental Health Promotion Project) do not need to be recorded as capital assets, since the items will be donated back to the community once the project is finished.
- Health benefit expenses have increased due to staff retention initiatives, as more staff now qualify for the program.
- Deferred revenues occur because some programs take place in a different year than when the funding is received. The auditor was provided with all the relevant agreements and contracts as requested.

Executive Director Highlights

- Funding for the Mental Health Promotion Project opened new sites in Wentworth and Portaupique. Staff hired for project.
- Started the Community Collaborative Food Network project in Cumberland.
- Cumberland was approved for the Cultural Connector Initiative set to start in fall 2024.
- Pension Plan Approved for Implementation June 1st as part of the Recruitment and Retention Strategy.
- Linda Legere Retired, a replacement was hired and has since resigned. Nancy Thurston has stepped up as Interim Executive Director during this time of transition.
- Building maintenance due to damage to the Colchester Building has been a focus of Nancy's energy recently with replacing a damaged tree with a gazebo in the play area and damage to the roof leading to water damage.
- New Youth Outreach Worker position.
- Integrated Youth Services Announcement for Cumberland.
- Family Navigator position for Colchester funded for one year by United Way.



During the 2024-2025 fiscal year together we

- Served 2037 different children/youth.
- Served 1257 different adults.
- Offered 170 different programs, workshops and services.
- Provided Home Visiting to 50 families, 62 adults, 162 children for a total of 702 visits.
- Inspected & Installed 138 car seats.
- Over 4000 meal kits/food bags distributed.
- Worked with over 70 different community partners.
