It was another busy year of programs and growth for the organization. The year began by celebrating our 25th Anniversary. There were special events held throughout the year, including recognizing our long-time funders and community partners at last year's AGM. Other special events included a \$25 for 25 Years Campaign and a newspaper story on the history of Maggie's Place, highlighting our special "Maggie". At this time, we would like to acknowledge that today is Maggie's birthday.

The Board held a retreat in November at The Peg in Masstown.
